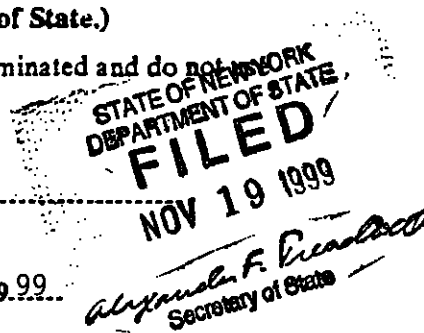



LOCAL LAW NUMBER 1 OF 1999, OF THE TOWN OF GRANBY
FOUR-YEAR TERM FOR THE ELECTIVE OFFICE OF TOWN CLERK

A local law providing a four-year term for the elective office of Town Clerk of the Town of Granby.

Be it enacted by the Town Board of the Town of Granby as follows:

SECTION 1. The term of office of elective Town Clerk of the Town of Granby shall be four years. Such four-year term shall commence on the first day of January following the first biennial town election after the effective date of this local law.

SECTION 2. At the biennial town election next following the effective date of this local law, and every four years thereafter, the Town Clerk shall be elected for a term of four years.

SECTION 3. This local law shall supersede in its application to the Town of Granby, Section 24 of the Town Law with respect to the term of office of the elective Town Clerk.

SECTION 4. This local law shall be submitted for approval to the electors of the Town of Granby at the next general town election to be held on November 2, 1999.

SECTION 5. Any other local law, ordinance or resolution inconsistent herewith is hereby repealed.

SECTION 6. This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State after approval by a majority of the electors voting thereon in accordance with the requirements of Section 27 of the Municipal Home Rule Law.

RESOLUTION

At a regular meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Granby, New York, held at the Town Hall on June 9, 1999, the following Resolution was moved and adopted:

WHEREAS, it has been proposed that the term of office of the elected Town Clerk of the Town of Granby be changed from two years to four years; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held on June 9, 1999, at 7:00 p.m. before the Town Board to obtain comment from the residents of the Town regarding the proposal; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has determined that changing the term of office of the elected Town Clerk from two years to four years would be in the best interests of the Town.

NOW, BE IT RESOLVED that the Town of Granby Town Board hereby enacts the Local Law changing the term of office of the elected Town Clerk of the Town of Granby from two years to four years, subject to a referendum of the registered voters of the Town to be held at the next regularly scheduled biennial election to be held on November 2, 1999, and the Town Clerk is hereby directed to prepare a Proposition on this matter for presentation to voters at the election.
